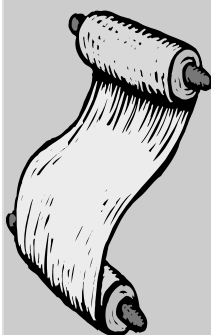

Get Involved in I Am Minneapolis: A Campaign for a City ID Card

Jewish Community Action and partners Mujeres En Liderazgo, Unite Here Local 17, the Family Partnership and other allies are working on a campaign to create a city ID card in Minneapolis. The idea was inspired by cities around the country, including San Francisco and 4 others, doing the same at the realization that there is no humane and just immigration reform on the horizon. The ID would help to integrate communities by making accessible the things those with documentation and citizens may take for granted. The card would benefit all Minneapolis residents by making housing, banking, and more accessible, as well as by offering perks such as local business discounts and more. Eventually, campaign organizers hope to include a bank card, bus pass, and library card function. While the card would not act as a driver's license, it would be an official government recognized identification card. Official support has come in from multiple organizations, individuals and businesses, as well as from the Minneapolis Chief of Police and 4 city council members. JCA Responds to Tornado Aftermath and Foreclosures

In the aftermath of the tornado that devastated north Minneapolis on May 22nd, Jewish Community Action and our partners in the Northside Community Reinvestment Coalition (NCRC) joined the response, with the placement of 70 volunteers at an emergency triage and an assessment doorknock in late May. We helped connect scores of residents with emergency basic needs and other forms of free resources. We met several residents

dealing with significant property damage and facing foreclosure. One of those residents, Ms. Cathy Spann, became the focus of an advocacy campaign early in June to persuade JP Morgan Chase Home Mortgage to extend her redemption period and allow her the time to secure funds to buy her house back out of foreclosure. JCA and NCRC celebrated a victory with a similar case in which our advocacy push persuaded CitiMortgage to give NCRC resident leader Carmelita

Patrick extra time to buy back her home, with financing through Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity and Build Wealth Minnesota.

JCA and Coalition Working to Extend Legal Status for Liberians

Jewish Community Action is again playing a lead role in the work of the Coalition for Permanent Residency to obtain legal status for Liberian immigrants in the United States. Minnesota is home to one of the largest Liberian communities in the United States seeking to extend legal status beyond September 30, 2011. Congressman Keith Ellison became the lead author of the legislation to provide permanent legal status for Liberians this year along with Senator Reed from Rhode Island. Due to the unlikelihood of passing this legislation, JCA and the coalition, are joining with groups across the country to convince President Obama to once again extend legal status through an executive order called Deferred Enforcement Departure (DED) for at least one or two more years. We will need your support in writing to President Obama.

Stops for Us Coalition Recognized with Environmental Justice Award

The *Transportation Equity/Stops for Us Coalition*, of which JCA is a founding member, will receive one of the Environmental Protection Agency's National Achievement in Environmental Justice Awards this summer for its work to secure the three additional stations as part of the Central Corridor Light Rail Transit system in 2010.

This award recognizes the coalition's three-year campaign to secure stations in the most transit dependent and low income areas, and to make sure the LRT line will better serve all people in the community—connecting people with jobs, housing and education.

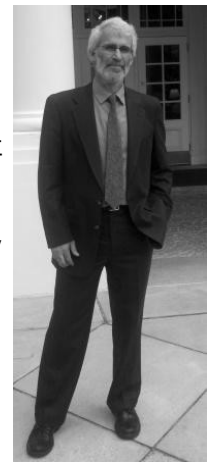
